## Mark Your Calendars for the Annual Meeting

Topics important to our community will be discussed at the meeting and your attendance is critical.

## **Update on Trail Maintenance**

As many of you are aware, the trails in our common area were very much in need of repair. This fall the Board approved Gossom & Costello Paving, Inc., as the contractor to perform the trail maintenance. To date, G&C has completed the following repairs:

- Removed and replaced the deteriorating portions of the upper and lower trails
- Added a 1 ½ to 2 inch layer of asphalt over the entire length of the upper trail

The cost of repairs totaled \$14,320. In anticipation of these repairs, we increased our reserves over the last 2 to 3 years to ensure funding for this large expense when incurred. Additional repair work is being planned for the spring, including dealing with the cracks in the lower trail and sealing both the upper and lower trails. Maintaining our trails is vital to both the safety and overall positive appearance of our community.

## Thermal Cameras on Loan at Library Branches

If you have a library card, you could start saving on your monthly cooling and heating bills. Thermal cameras are on loan through the Fairfax County Public Library. These cameras, which attach to your smartphone, allow you to see hot and cold spots in your home that aren't visible to the naked eye. You'll be able to see your way to savings by finding air leaks and poor insulation. These easily fixable problems may be costing you. On average, \$200 to \$400 per year could be going to waste as a result of drafty doors, windows or other air leaks, according to the U.S. Department of Energy.

The cameras are available through a partnership with the library and Energy Action Fairfax, a program to help homeowners save money, cut energy use, and reduce their carbon footprint.

The cameras are easy to use, and work with many versions of popular smartphones. The cameras can also take spot temperature measurements and show results in a variety of color palates.

Put a camera on hold today and it will be delivered to the library branch of your choice. Go to the library catalog and search for "thermal camera." A total of eight cameras are available to loan for this free program.

We've all probably experienced waiting in long lines at the Department of Motor Vehicles. Sometimes it's unavoidable, but you may be able to bypass some wait time by trying out one of DMV's mobile customer service centers.

DMV 2 Go are handicapped-accessible full service offices that provide all DMV transactions, including applying for and renewing driver's licenses and ID cards and Virginia's new veterans ID card. Thanks to partnerships with other government agencies, customers may also purchase certified copies of Virginia vital records including birth, marriage, divorce, and death certificates, obtain E-ZPass transponders and apply for hunting and fishing licenses.
