5 Ways to Add "Curb Appeal" Value to Your Home

- Wash Up—Power wash the exterior to remove dirt build-up and other debris. Clean off the roof and gutters, and don't forget the windows. Wash them inside and out to keep natural light flowing freely throughout your home's interior.
- Outside Updates—Re-stain the deck or reseal the patio, if needed. Make sure fencing is in good condition.
- Prune and Trim—Highlight your yard by pruning all trees and plants. Keep the lawn mowed and weed the garden beds.
- 4. Attention to Detail—Keep your front door looking fresh with a new coat of paint or consider replacing the door, if necessary. Make sure house numbers stand out and the doorbell works. Don't forget the mailbox. It should be upright, secure and aesthetically pleasing.
- Pop of Color—Add interest with a new doormat or plant some seasonal bright flowers. Choose colors that complement your home's exterior.

Bagging Yard Waste in Plastic is NOT Fantastic

Instead of collecting yard waste in plastic bags, consider using reusable containers, paper bags, and bundling branches. Using plastic bags for collection of yard waste is not a sustainable or cost effective practice.

An estimated 20 percent of yard waste is lost because it clings to the plastic bags that must be disposed of as waste. When breaking open the bags, small pieces of plastic make their way into the compost, compromising quality and resulting in reduced revenues. While paper bags may cost a little more than plastic bags, their use reduces overall environmental impacts and processing costs. Using paper bags or reusable containers instead of plastic is a win-win for the facilities that manage our yard waste and those who ultimately use these products to improve the health of soil and the look of their yards.

Local Farmers Markets

Summer may be over, but you can still take advantage of local farmers markets and the fresh goods they have to offer. The Vienna Farmers Market is only open until October 28th; however, there are a number of other markets in the area that remain open longer, including: *Reston* (11900 Lawyers Rd, St. John Neumann Catholic Church); Wednesdays 3:00-7:00; open through mid-November. *Oakton* (2854 Hunter Mill Rd, Unity of Fairfax Church); Saturdays 10:00-2:00; open year round.

These and other findings prompted the official theme for this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign: "Every Second Counts - Plan Two Ways Out".
