Spring Clean Up of the Park

The annual spring clean up of the Glencannon Community Park (also known as the Common Area) is scheduled for the last two Saturdays in April from 9 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. We hope many of you will be able to participate on one or both of these days!

On **April 21**st, for those not available to attend on April 28th, we will have a preliminary clean up of the stream bed (wear boots), and the wooded areas (wear gloves). Our goal is to haul trash, fallen branches and sizable limbs from these areas creating piles of debris in accessible areas.

April 28th is our big clean-up day and we will have the help of a hired crew who will cut down identified dead trees (a continuing process from years past), trim trees of any dangerous limbs in high traffic areas, and haul away all the debris if it cannot be chipped. This is also the day for "weedwackers" to trim areas along the pathways, as has been done in the past, and invasive vine removal. Anyone impervious to the evils of poison ivy can really be used on this day! **(RAIN DATE: MAY 5)**

With respect to the fragile creek banks and animal habitats that are under our stewardship in this park area—we have heard the concerns voiced by many in the community and we plan to proceed cautiously in these areas. There will be no clear cutting or "bushhogging" along the creek banks, only invasive vine removal. And not all dead trees will be removed so that nesting and feeding places remain for many different types of birds. New reusable signs will be available for clean up in the park and for advertising the annual meeting and other events. Signs will be put out at the park entrances to notify residents of times and dates for these events.

The Committee will be charged with creating a long range plan for the Common Areas and a budget for their maintenance and improvement. Homeowner Access to Board Meetings

The Glencannon Homeowners' Association Board meets the second Wednesday of each month at 7:30. Any homeowner who wants to meet with the Board to present a proposal or concern should call the president to be put on the agenda and should present the topic to be discussed in writing at least one week in advance. The presentation time will be limited to ten minutes for each topic. Any matter which will have significant impact on the community will be presented to the community to determine the broader views before a decision is made.

Speeding Problem on Garrett Street

A letter has been sent to Fairfax County Supervisor Hudgins requesting a follow-up to the traffic study which was presented at the annual meeting. The police have targeted Garrett Street as a concern for speeding and as a result they will be monitoring the speed with radar and issuing tickets. Community members are asked to help by observing the 25 mile an hour speed limit throughout the neighborhood.

Lights on for Safety!

We would like to remind all residents to please turn on your outdoor lights at night. Because the community does not have traditional street lights, we need to rely on the driveway lamp posts and front porch lights at each home to keep our streets safe. On a recent drive through the community one resident noted 30% of homes without proper lighting and brought this to the attention of the board. Let's strive to have all lights repaired and shining brightly!

Curb Painting of House Numbers

House numbers painted on the curb can help with locating a house in cases of emergency. The police and fire departments highly recommend that house numbers be painted on the curb for this purpose. The person who has done this for Glencannon residents in the past is no longer listed in the telephone directory. If any of you know of someone who offers this service, please let someone on the Board know. We will provide this information to all homeowners if it becomes available. We encourage all homeowners to get this done for safety reasons and for uniformity within the community.

Yard Debris Removal

With the onset of warmer weather, the board would like to remind residents about yard waste and debris removal. Yard waste is picked up on Wednesdays in our community from March-December. Please use the following guidelines:

- Grass clippings, leaves and twigs may be placed in paper bags, clear plastic bags or in personal containers and should be set at the curb on the day of pick up. Yard waste should not be placed in dark plastic bags.
- Brush and limbs must be cut to 4-foot lengths, bundled (arm-full size) with rope or twine, and should not exceed 50 lbs. Tree limbs larger than 6 inches in diameter and 4 feet in length will not be collected.
- Collection is limited to 20 bags, bundles or containers of yard debris per scheduled pick up day.
- Customers with more that 20 bags or bundles can call your service company to arrange for a special pick up.

Architectural Control Committee

The following homeowners have agreed to serve on the Architectural Control Committee: James Owen, Ron Tharrington, and Barbara Stewart. The purpose of the committee as outlined in the by-laws is "to assure that the general appearance of the Glencannon community remains consistent with the intent and design of the original community. No exterior addition or changes or alteration shall be made to the individual properties until the plans and specifications showing the nature, kind, shape height, materials and location of the same shall have been submitted to and approved in writing as to harmony of external design and location in relation to surrounding structures and topography by the Architectural Control Committee."
